Definitions

- 1. "Number of students who began the program "means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100 % of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- 2. <u>"Students available for graduation"</u> is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- 3. <u>"Number on-time Graduates"</u> is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within reporting calendar year.
- 4. <u>On-Time Completion Rate</u> is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- 5. <u>"150% Graduates"</u> is the number of students who completed the completed within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates)
- 6. <u>150% Completion Rate</u>" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length.
- 7. <u>"Graduates Available for Employment"</u> means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

STUDENTS RIGHT TO CANCEL
